CANDIDATES QUIZZED AT ELECTION HUSTINGS

At the meeting, which was organised by Pembrokeshire Friends of the Earth, the candidates were quizzed on issues such as the increase in extremes of weather due to climate change, the need to grow more food locally, pollution in local rivers and seas, the decline of wildlife, improvements in public transport and the job and economic opportunities of the green economy.

A spokesperson Pembrokeshire Friends of the Earth said:

“The candidates mostly said the right things about important environmental and economic issues, as they have been doing for many

years, but now have to show far more commitment to put these concerns into practice. We don't want this to be just another exercise in lip service. We need far more action now to offer our children and grandchildren a better future by preventing nature and climate collapse.”
